2024 AJAA Junior Nationals Rules and Regulations

Sponsorship and Eligibility:

This show is sponsored by the American Junior Aberdeen Association. The show is open to all AJAA members. Members who turned 22 years old before January 1, 2024 are not eligible. **No alcohol or smoking will be permitted.**

- ❖ Animals must be registered in the sole ownership of the junior exhibitor by **May 20th, 2024**, to be eligible to show.
- ❖ Original registration certificates or copies for each animal must be presented at the time of check-in. Tattoos found to be missing, illegible, or in any other way incorrect with official AAA records will be disqualified.
- ❖ Entries must meet Iowa health regulations.
- ❖ Entry fees are **\$55 per head**. Bred and Owned Heifer Entries are **\$40 per head**. Entries must be made by 11:59 on or before **May 25th 2024**. Late entries are **\$75 per head** and will be accepted until **June 1st, 2024**.
- ❖ Online entries will be done on Showman App. Please look for the link for entries on the AAA website and our social media.
- ❖ Cattle check-in will begin Monday, June 17th at 8:30AM.
- ❖ Stalls will be assigned to exhibitors according to state.
- ❖ **GENERATORS ARE HIGHLY RECCOMENDED!**
- ❖ **We reserve the right to pull DNA on any animal.**
- ❖ To maintain a high degree of confidence in the show, the AJAA reserves the right to disqualify any animals that have been fit or treated in an unethical manner.
 - Unethical fitting includes any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter the normal conformation of the animal.
 - This includes any cutting or tearing of the hide, or underneath the hide, or removal of any tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal.
 - Any attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development, dying or coloring of the hair coat that alters the natural coloration or artificial tail or tail head polls will disqualify the animal.
 - Any attempt to change the degree of firmness of any animal is considered unethical. Artificial means that the filling of cattle internally is prohibited.
- ❖ Initial bedding will be provided. Additional bedding will be available. Tie out bedding is not provided.
- ❖ Sullivan Supply will be onsite for show supply needs.
- ❖ Exhibitors must be present to exhibit their own animals entered in the show; emergencies will be decided on by the AJAA Board of Directors.
- ❖ Tie out stalls will be available on the fairgrounds.
- ❖ Any bull older than 12 months must be shown with a nose ring.

Arrival & Departure Times

Fullblood Division

Fullblood heifers born on or after August 1, 2022 are eligible. The show committee will divide the following classes into a total of 12 classes, including four division champions. Every effort will be made to have no more than 16 head per class.

Percentage Heifers

Females exhibited in the percentage heifer class must have been born on or after August 1, 2022 and be a registered percentage female from 50% to less than Fullblood American Aberdeen.

Bred-and-Owned Heifers

Bred-and-owned shows will be separate for Fullblood and Percentage heifers. All heifers exhibited must show the exhibitor as owning the entry's dam at the time of conception. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder and current owner on the registration papers.

Cow/Calf Pair:

Both a Fullblood division and a Percentage division will be available. Two classes of cow/calf pairs for each division: two-year olds and cows 3 to 7 years of age. Cows must be lactating with their natural calf at side born on or after November 1, 2023. Heifer calves may enter individual heifer classes and Bred-and-Owned divisions. Bull calves may be entered in the Junior Bull Calf Division. The calf must be registered and meet the criteria for the heifer or bull calf show classes.

Aberdeen Steer Rules

- ❖ No steers over 24 months of age
- ❖ Divisions and will be divided by weights (with the exception of steers over 17 months old that will automatically go into the market division regardless of weight).
- ❖ All steers will be required to have registration papers with the AAA
- ❖ Division weight break will be as follows

	87.5% to Fullblood	87.49% to 50%
Prospect	Up to 500lbs	Up to 700lbs
Progress	501-700lbs	701-900lbs
Market	Over 700lbs or 17-20 months	Over 900lbs or 17-20 months

Market Animals:

- ❖ All steers and heifer between 49.99% to 25% Aberdeen are eligible to compete.
- ❖ If you plan to bring a market animal, you must enter and show an Aberdeen breeding animal of half-blood or higher. (Breeding animals must follow their respected show rules and must be present with market animals at Junior Nationals).
- ❖ Market animal division weight break will be as followed:

	87.5% to Fullblood
Prospect	Up to 800lbs
Progress	801-1,000lbs
Market	Over 1,000lbs or 17-20 months

Bred- and-Owned Bulls:

Bulls born on or after January 1, 2023 are eligible. There will be a fullblood and percentage show having a Junior and Senior division. The exhibitor must be listed as the breeder and current owner on the registration papers.

*** Bulls will no longer need to be semen tested to show per AAA's rules***

Ultrasound Competition (Optional) – Monday, June 17th

Entry per animal \$20. Top heifer and top steer will be awarded. The contest will be scored by combining the Ribeye per HWT score and the IMF score. Ties will be broken on ribeye shape. This contest will not be used for points

- ❖ The AJAA BOD is still currently working on securing someone to perform this contest
- ❖ Entries for this contest will be done at registration

Poster Contest – Monday, June 17th

- ❖ Poster will be turned in at Check-In on Monday, June 17th by 12pm
- ❖ Topic – Why do you love American Aberdeens?
- ❖ This contest is for junior and pee-wee members. Will not count towards Overall points.

Skill-a-thon Contest – Monday, June 17th

- ❖ This contest is designed to increase awareness of the issues of animal well-being, quality assurance and show animal ethics. Contestants will go from station to station complete identification or scenarios presented. Identification or scenarios can be based on the following:
 - Livestock Equipment
 - Beef Breed Identification
 - Retail meat cut identification
 - Feedstuff identification
 - Reproduction
 - Quality assurance exercise
 - Management, performance, or marketing problems
 - Other
- ❖ Full details will be available at registration.
- ❖ This contest will be used for point accumulation.

Potluck Dinner – Monday, June 17th

Bring a main dish, side, desert, or all of the above to share and enjoy the time with friends and family.

- ❖ A-H: Main Dish
- ❖ I-P: Side Dish
- ❖ Q-Z: Desert

Showdown Showmanship – Tuesday, June 18th

Intermediates, Juniors, and Seniors will be eligible to participate

- ❖ Participants must fit their own animal in their own chute in the provided designated area.
* Note: No adult or other AJAA member is permitted to help in fitting*
- ❖ Participants have 45 minutes to complete their fitting process. *Note: Absolutely NO fitting is to be done prior to contest start
- ❖ Participants must show their animal following fitting. * Participants will be judged on both fitting as well as showmanship skills in over all tabulation.
- ❖ Points will NOT be rewarded for this contest

Speech Contest – Tuesday, June 18th

- ❖ Contestants will put together a speech according to their age division.
- ❖ The contestant will be evaluated on organization and content, language and delivery, presentation, total effectiveness, and in response to questions.
- ❖ Visual aids are limited to physical charts etc. No slides; overheads or any other electrical aids will be allowed.
- ❖ Deductions of half a point per ten seconds will be made from the score by each judge for speeches under or over the specified length.
- ❖ The speeches will be performed away from others and will only be performed in front of judges and people helping with the contest.

Division:	Time Limits:	Topic:
Junior	Not to exceed 5 minutes	How was the American Aberdeen developed and what is the history in the United States?
Intermediate	Not to exceed 5 minutes	How can the American Aberdeen breed make an impact in the cattle industry?
Senior	5 to 7 minutes	To Be Determined – Seniors will present an extemporaneous speech. Materials will be provided and given a set amount of time prior to presentation.

Quiz Bowl – Tuesday, June 18th

- ❖ Quiz Bowl is a single elimination tournament with a participation drawn at random.
- ❖ Questions cover both the beef industry in general and the American Aberdeen Breed.
- ❖ Each round consists of 15 toss of questions
- ❖ Any contestant may answer a toss-up question; however, the contestant must first press the buzzer and be recognized by the quizmaster

- ❖ The quizmaster reads a toss-up question until the question is completed of a contestant buzzes in
- ❖ If a contestant buzzes in during the reading of a question, the quizmaster stops reading immediately, the contestant must begin his/her answer within 5 seconds
 - Contestants are warned that toss-up questions may have more than one part, so “buzzing in early” may hurt the team’s score.
- ❖ If the answer given by the first responder is correct, they will gain the points.
- ❖ If the answer given by the first contestant is incorrect, the toss-up question will be repeated for the opposing team.
 - An individual on the opposing team must sound his/her buzzer before the individual may answer the question
 - The team is never allowed to confer on a toss-up question
- ❖ If neither team answers the toss-up question correctly, the quizmaster goes on to the next question
- ❖ In case of a tie there will be 3 toss up questions given to the round finalists. In this “sudden death” round whoever answers 2 of 3 questions correctly will be declared the winner.

Team Fitting – Wednesday, June 19th

Sponsored by Sullivan Supply – Stock Show U

Teams will consist of at least four participants chosen at random; including at least one junior, intermediate, and senior individual.

- ❖ A **35-minute** time limit is set to allow the team to prepare or “fit” the animal with proper grooming techniques. Animals will not be shown.
- ❖ An AJAA team member participating in the contest must be willing to use their animal and chute for the contest.
- ❖ This contest is for points.

Team Marketing – Wednesday, June 19th

- ❖ Two/Three people will be on a team. Teams must include members from the same age group. Teams will be picked by randomly drawing names out of a hat and announced the morning of the event.
- ❖ The team will be responsible for developing its own marketing strategy.
- ❖ Presentations will be a minimum of 5 minutes, but not to exceed 10 min including questions including questions. The presentation will be stopped at the end of 10 minutes. Each individual on the team will be expected to speak during the presentation. The objective of the team is to sell their animal.
- ❖ The following topics should be discussed:

- Pedigree information
- Performance information
- Visual characteristics
- ❖ The judge's questions will not necessarily be limited to the three topics listed above.
- ❖ Teams will be discounted for using notes but are encouraged to use reference materials.
- ❖ Each team will be responsible for selecting an animal to use.
 - Two copies of registration certificates should be provided. (Printer available in AJAA Office)
 - Points will be deducted for teams that do not supply two certificates.
 - In addition to the registration certificates, each team may supply performance data, pictures, show records, etc. as part of the sales package to the panel of judges.
- ❖ Points will be awarded as follows:
 - Knowledge - 25 points
 - Ability to communicate - 25 points
 - Team organization - 25 points
 - Overall effect - 25 points
- ❖ Up to 10 points will be deducted for dependence on notes
- ❖ Five points will be subtracted if registration certificates are not submitted.
- ❖ Ten points will be subtracted if all three team members do not speak.
- ❖ Two points will be subtracted for each minute the team presentation goes under 3 minutes and the presentation goes over 5 minutes.
- ❖ AJAA Directors reserve the right to decrease team members in the junior division to 2 to increase participation.

No-Fit Showmanship – Thursday, June 20th

Sponsored by Sullivan Supply – Stock Show U

- ❖ AJAA members who did not enter an animal in the National Junior Show are allowed to borrow an animal from another AJAA member.
- ❖ Contestants will exhibit animals in a clean, but unfitted condition.
- ❖ Every participant will need to be able to handle the animal by themselves safely.
- ❖ Age Divisions will be broken down into as many heats as deemed necessary. The judge will choose the number of individuals asked to return from each heat.
- ❖ Show will run oldest to youngest or at the judges preference.
- ❖ Age Break: As of January 1st, 2024
 - Senior (15-21 years of age)
 - Intermediate (10-14 years of age)
 - Junior (9 years of age and under)

PeeWee Showmanship – Thursday, June 20th

- ❖ Exhibitors must be able to handle the calf adequately and safely. Helpers may help in this division. It is preferred that the helper be an AJAA member.
- ❖ This division is set up for any member who feels that it is the appropriate division for them.
- ❖ Exhibitors must be an AJAA member.
- ❖ No points will be accumulated from the division for the overall awards

Over-the-Hill Showmanship – Thursday, June 20th:

This contest is for FUN & ENTERTAINMENT - Let's have the "professionals" show us how it's really done. The contest is for previous generations of showmen. Participants must be over 25 years old to enter and each may borrow an animal or not even use one!

Overall Points System

Overall awards will be awarded to the following:

- ❖ Senior (15-21 years of age): Champion and Reserve Champion
- ❖ Intermediate (10-14 years of age): Champion and Reserve Champion
- ❖ Junior (9 years of age and under): Champion and Reserve Champion

Winners will be selected based on the following point system:

- ❖ Exhibit one or more animals – 10 points

If the contestants of any age division are in the top six of any of the listed contests, including Skill-a-thon, Speech, Quiz Bowl, Team Fitting, Team Marketing, and showmanship, they will receive points for the following:

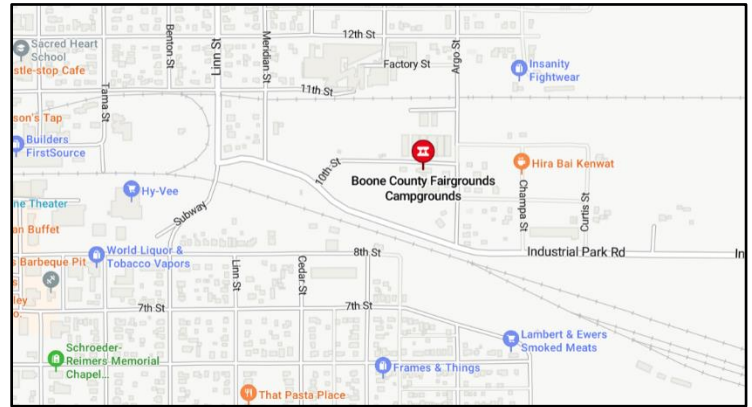
- ❖ 1st place – 10 points
- ❖ 2nd place – 9 points
- ❖ 3rd place – 8 points
- ❖ 4th place – 7 points
- ❖ 5th place – 6 points
- ❖ 6th place – 5 points

Premier Exhibitor:

- ❖ The AJAA will present an award to the premier exhibitor of the show.
- ❖ The premier exhibitor will be determined by the exhibitor's placement in individual steer, heifer, bull and cow/calf classes.
- ❖ Points are accumulated as follows:
 - 1st Place- 5 pts
 - 2nd Place-3 pts
 - 3rd Place - 1 pt
- ❖ Maximum number of placements used to determine the winner shall be limited to three. In the case of a tie, additional placements will be used.
- ❖ **This will be announced at the end of the Show**

- ❖ Must have participated in Junior Nationals for at least one year prior to applying
- ❖ Applicant must be a member of the AJAA in good standing
- ❖ Application form must be sent to americanjunioraberdeen@gmail.com by June 1st, 2024 or turned in at Junior Nationals
- ❖ Term length is 2 years
- ❖ Application must be accompanied by a one page, typed, single spaced essay outlining the goals of an AJAA Director.

Applicants will be asked to provide a list of their experiences, relevant projects and offices held, or club responsibilities, descriptions of any recognition or awards received and achievements through showing American Aberdeen Cattle.

Board members must be willing to travel, at their own expense to the Junior National Show, the National Western Stock Show, and one additional meeting during every year during their term.

American Aberdeen Queen and Princess Rules

The new AJAA Queen and Princess will be chosen during the 2024 Junior Nationals show in Boone, Iowa. During the Junior National Event, AJAA will select a new Queen and Princess. Members interested in running for Queen or Princess position may complete the application form and email to: americanjunioraberdeen@gmail.com by May 31st, 2024.

Qualifications:

- ❖ Contestants for Queen must be between the ages of 15 to 21 and the Princess must be between the ages of 9 to 14, as of January 1, 2024.
- ❖ Must be single, never married and no children
- ❖ Must be a member, in good standing, of the American Junior Aberdeen Association
- ❖ Contestants may serve consecutive years, but will have to resubmit an application.

Rules:

- ❖ Queen, at her own expense, will provide a color or black and white photograph to the board for publicity purposes
- ❖ Contestants must complete the Master of Beef Advocacy Program sponsored by the Beef Check-off program
- ❖ When the Queen and Princess are representing the American Aberdeen Breed, she shall wear her sash at all times. Her tiara will be worn most of the time. The Queen and Princess do not have to wear it when it is not conducive to the situation she is in. The Queen and Princess are to use their best judgement. Also, professional/appropriate dress is very important. Please ask what the proper attire is when scheduling an event if you are unsure.

Activities:

American Aberdeen Royalty is to attend **National Western Stock Show** and **Junior Nationals**, at their own expense. Additional shows, sales, or conferences are not required. Duties at shows will include:

- ❖ Pass out ribbons at Open and Junior Shows
- ❖ Meet people and promote the breed
- ❖ Take pictures with the winners and exhibitors. This includes backdrop photos.
- ❖ Attend the banquet at the National Western Stock Show

Awards:

- ❖ Leather Sash – to be returned at the end of their reign
- ❖ Tiara – to be kept
