



1. This reciprocal agreement is set forth between the Australian Lowline Cattle Association, and the American Aberdeen Association
2. For purposes of consistency all fullblood cattle registered with the Australian Lowline Cattle Association, and the American Aberdeen Association shall be referred to as cattle.
3. Cattle must comply with the breed standard set forth by each association and are subject to disqualification for registration upon failure to meet such standards.
4. Cattle registered with any of the above named associations, shall be eligible for herd book entry within the above named associations, to include all rights and privileges of all cattle pertaining to registration.
5. Cattle must be DNA parent verified (PV), and include a copy of the PV along with the current registration certificate to the reciprocal Association, as well as the appropriated fees for registration/import.
6. Cattle must be permanently identified in a manner which is consistent with their domestic registry and will be designated with the country of original registration as a prefix or suffix to their identification number.
7. Registration and import fee consistent with the foreign association's current fee schedule must be remitted at the time of application for registry.
8. Applicant must be a member in good standing of both reciprocal associations in order to apply for a registration with a foreign herd book.
9. Cattle must be initially registered with the breed association of the country of origin. If no such association exists, any association included in this reciprocal agreement may be utilized.
